#### INTRODUCTION

This last year we have had some clarity about our future, allowing us to devote more time and energy to the development our parish, including the fostering of closer links with St. Albans. This is beginning to pay off, with joint catechesis with St. Albans and the Deanery an important innovation. We hope to continue to build our community over the coming year.

#### **PARISH REPORT**

Our Sunday Mass and the coffee morning continue their double-act – the Mass developing spirituality, the coffee morning our friendships and teamwork. Many helpers contribute to the Mass and even more to the coffee morning.

Our Mass is supported by the cleaners, flower arrangers, greeters, Eucharistic Ministers, readers, altar servers, Children's Liturgy helpers, and the Music Group. After the Mass the collection has to be counted and banked - a mundane but essential task!

Our Parish Activities Group is now chaired by Geoff Dennis after Tom Culleton stood down after 27 years of valiant service – thank you Tom. With Lisa Radford as secretary and 12 helpers, the PAG runs the friendly, heart-warming Sunday coffee mornings for parishioners to chat and catch up with one another, building the parish family while raising funds. Money from the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of the month is for the PAG; the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday is for the Liz Nightingale fund; the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday for the Parish and the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday supports a chosen charity.

Over the year the PAG has paid out over £2,000 for various social activities and charities, included almost £1,000 to the Parish. We all look forward to the Christmas Coffee morning, a beano with mince pies and sherry. Many thanks to all who put in so much effort to the PAG.

Our Children's Liturgy Group, coordinated by Lisa Radford, welcomes mums and dads who would like to take part in this vital work of preparing the next generation in the understanding of the faith. The children learn to apply the teachings of Christ and consider others. Recently the children worked on the theme of the harvest, and shortly we will start preparing the Christmas vigil Mass. The children love getting involved, while developing their faith. Thanks to all the members who help with the sessions and their preparation. We also recognize the help given by Sonia Garcia, who has moved with her family back to her native Spain.

From the well-spring of our Mass come many other works; the support for charities - CAFOD, Faith in Families, retired clergy. Hall bookings and Finance have to be managed, Buildings and gardens are kept in good order all involving many volunteers. Our scrap drive raises useful cash while providing a handy facility for parishioners.

Funds raised for retired clergy £10,279.95, 40% of our target.

Our prayer Group says the ring rosary, although members get no younger and may struggle to attend.

Our attendance with a single Sunday Mass has stabilized at an average of 115.

Our buildings are in good order, warm and comfortable. Our Hall is more attractive, so earning ~£7k towards Parish funds last year. Of course wear and tear is increased so we need more maintenance! Don't forget that the Hall and the Meeting room are available for hire, with a bar if required.

Some improvements to the buildings have been carried out, notably the new work sacristy and side door. There is a very slow drain from the new sink unit, due to deterioration of the soak-away drain. There is little that we can do about it in the short term.

By the time this meeting takes place we will be committing ourselves to the biggest expenditure for a long time; the roof is about to be renewed. This work is essential to prevent future damage to the interior. After careful consideration, and thanks to the efforts of our parishioners, the work is affordable. Nevertheless we would ask for any donations possible. Next we would like to rework the very old and tired toilets. The gentlemen have a difficult job using their cubicle, as the door comes within inches of the toilet – far from easy access. It is hoped that we can include a new 'ambulatory accessible' cubicle with nappy changing; full accessibility isn't possible in the space available.

Obviously our buildings need ongoing maintenance, and there will be significant items of expenditure from time to time. From our knowledge of the state of the estate, we have attempted to list major items that might possibly arise in the longer term, with estimates as to dates and costs:

#### 1) Church

- a) Side windows repair work has found rot in some sills. Estimate £8k within 5 years.
- b) Carpet must be 25 years old now, can't last for ever. Expensive!
- c) Use of former sacristy Music Group or servers' vestry? £2k within 2 years
- d) Organ alcove consider alternative use useless for sound as it's a box to prevent sound travelling to/from the body of the Church.
- e) Main external doors £1.5k?
- f) Redecorate £250 within the next 5 years.

#### 2) Hall

- a) Toilets £5-10k, spring/summer 2015
- b) Ceiling and lighting existing ceiling dirty and noisy
- c) Hall-Meeting room doors £3k
- d) Main doors £1.5k

- 3) Car park
  - a) Renew markings -£300 early 2015
  - b) Extra parking spaces expensive!

The above work is overseen by the Parish Pastoral Council and the Finance Committee; we also liaise with the deanery Council and of course the PPC works closely with the St. Albans PPC to foster closer cooperation.
